SFWDA Grant Terms and Conditions

SFWDA has established this program for the benefit of its members and their OHV areas, both public and private. The SFWDA Grant initiative is our largest annual project committing a significant portion of the association net income to this program. The SFWDA Grant initiative supports the membership and regional initiatives focused on our core missions – Conservation, Education, and Recreation.

Acceptance of these terms and conditions are required for the grant to be awarded and to receive the financial aid.

Listed below are common project types for each category however, these are only examples and grants are not limited to these project types.

Requirements for Public Lands Trail Improvements/Access Grants

- Must include permission for the project from the appropriate land manager
- Must adhere to all environmental permitting requirements local, state and federal
- Must have an operations and maintenance plan for the property; and provide an implementation schedule for review
- Agree to maintain best operating practices for three years
- Agree to signage recognizing SFWDA as a contributor (signage provided by SFWDA)
- Applicant must be a SFWDA Business and/or Land Partner member
- Provide SFWDA photographic documentation during construction and of completed project
- Provide copies of planning documents, engineering drawings and other associated documentation as appropriate

Requirements for Private Lands Trail Improvements/Access Grants

- Must adhere to all local, state and federal environmental permitting requirements
- Must have an operations and maintenance plan for the property; and provide an implementation schedule available for review
- Agree to maintain best operating practices for three years
- Agree to signage recognizing SFWDA as a contributor (signage provided by SFWDA)
- Allow SFWDA access to inspect practice
- Agree that the use of the land is to serve the recreational needs of our broad 4 wheeling community and not be restricted to all SFDWA members
- Applicant must be a SFWDA Business and/or Land Partner member
- Provide SFWDA photographic documentation during construction and of completed project
- Provide evidence of sustainability through long term lease or ownership
- Provide copies of planning documents, engineering drawings and other associated documentation as appropriate

Requirements for Education/Training Grants

- Provide copies of training materials
- Provide agenda/curriculum
- Provide schedule for the training
- Provide list of attendees and contact information
- Provide photographic documentation from the class
- Must include SFWDA logo on cover pages and in PowerPoint showing sponsorship
- Include SFWDA signage at training facility (signage to be provided by SFWDA)
- Provide membership brochures and information about SFWDA
- Training must be based on the principles of Tread Lightly

SFWDA Decision Process

- Application submitted (online) by deadline which may be up to 120 days prior to work commencement planned date.
- Email notice alerts all BOD members of grant request and to initiate the review
- Scoring sheet (To Be Developed) will be used to force rank applications by each BOD member
- Scores compiled and grants awarded based on available budget and scoring results
- SFWDA BOD members involved with the grant request via club, land use or other association, real or perceived, shall recuse themself from the deliberation and final decision process. The BOD member may participate in project explanation and justification.

Draft Scoring Sheet (without point weighting)

- 1. Application and associated documents are available for review and are complete with stated time frames
- 2. Project meets SFWDA vision, mission and goals for promoting OHV recreation, conservation and education. The final decision on the criteria met or not for each area is at the sole discretion of the SFWDA BOD.
- 3. Is the project sustainable? Is it proposed in an area that is sustainable?
- 4. Will it be helpful in promoting SFWDA's membership goals and objectives?
- 5. Is the requestor a Southern member?
- 6. Are all applicable permits in order?
- 7. Are there any environmental concerns?
- 8. Has a maintenance plan been developed?
- 9. Has a schedule been presented? It is acceptable?
- 10. Does the project benefit our outdoor recreation users?
- 11. Is the land owner, property owner or other agent on board with proposed project?
- 12. If applicable, are the balance of project funds committed and in what time frame?
- 13. Any hold harmless and/or indemnity agreements executed?

Additional Grant Information

The Recreational Trails Program in your particular state may be an additional source of funds. In most cases the SFWDA Grant could be used as part of the match monies to leverage additional dollars for your projects. Be sure to check it out when planning your project. Here is a table of information that may assist you. The Federal requirements set aside 30% of the total budgets for motorized recreation. Also, the maximum grant application for most states in capped at \$100,000. Given a 20 to 25% match is required that means a project could amount to about \$125,000. SFWDA grant maximum is \$5,000 which could be used to leverage \$25,000 in RTP funding at a 20% match requirement.

Unfortunately, the 2015 budgets have not been set yet as the RTP has not been reauthorized by Congress. Check with your local state for the latest.
